Jacques Villenevue was the official race winner, but Scott Goodyear looked certain to post Honda's first Indy Car victory - at the most important race of them all - until a controversial laterace official's call cost him a five-lap penalty at today's 79th running of the Indianapolis 500.

Goodyear took the lead at the green flag of today's race from his starting position on the outside of the front row, led the first nine laps, and contended throughout the day, leading a total of 42 of the 200 laps, marking the first time a Honda-powered car has led an Indy Car race. He also set the fastest race lap of 224.009 mph on lap 179, another first for Honda's Indy Car program.

Goodyear regained the lead from laps 33-35, 66-67, 78-81 and 117-120, then became part of a thrilling four-ear battle for the lead (with Jimmy Vasser, Scott Pruett and Jacques Villeneuve) from laps 150-170. However Vasser's crash on lap 171 enabled Goodyear to retake the lead on lap 176, with Pruett and Villeneuve close behind.


Then Pruett crashed in turn two on lap 184, apparently after sliding on oil. As Goodyear came down to take the restart on lap 190, race officials ruled that he passed the pace car prior to the green. The #24 Tasman Motorsports Reynard Honda was black-flagged, but team owner Steve Home decided to keep Goodyear on the circuit to the finish. As a result, even though he was the first car to complete the 200-lap distance, officials stopped scoring Goodyear after lap 195 and Villeneuve was first to see the checkered flag for his first-ever Indy 500 triumph.

Meanwhile, rookie Andre Ribeiro also posted a very impressive run in the #31 Tasman Motorsports Reynard Honda. Starting on the outside of the fourth row as the fastest rookie in Indianapolis history, Ribeiro ran as high as second and looked certain for a top-five finish until delayed by a broken throttle linkage on lap 122. Although his Tasman Motorsports crew was able to complete repairs, the 29-year-old Indy Lights graduate lost a total of 13 laps, dropping him to a unrepresentative 18th place finish.

Race Report -- 2

Scott Goodyear, driver, #24 Tasman Motorsports Reynard-Honda: "I was very pleased overall with the race. Number one, we set a goal at the start of this month and the team worked flawlessly. We had a strong engine. We played the game right all day long and I was very pleased with that. You need to be there at the end so you can have an opportunity for racing at the end. We went racing at the end and even from the (pit) stop before that. We were faster than everybody else out there on the race track. So, I feel that we won the race."

(On the restart penalty): "There were numerous times today when people almost drilled into the back of the pace car. The pace car appeared to be running very slow through turns three and four. I passed Scott (Pruett) on a restart when he almost hit the pace car. The biggest issue for myself is that as I went past the pace car I looked up towards the signal light and it was green. I think that when the green light comes on it means go. You saw it today. Anybody that was in the lead on a restart immediately fell back to second or third. It was a situation that was going on all day. What the reason was for it, I'm not really sure but there were others with the same problem."

Andre Ribeiro, driver, #31 Tasman Motorsports Reynard-Honda: "It was a very good race. The car was handling very well and I quickly was able to establish a good rhythm. We were competitive sooner than I thought. Although I made a mistake on the first pit stop, we still managed to run second for more than 30 laps. Eventually, the throttle problem cost us a lot of time, but overall I'm very pleased to finish my first Indy 500. We had a great day."

Steve Horne, owner, Tasman Motorsports: "The (controversial) restart was on television, we'll have to go with the videos. We had an onboard camera on the car and that should tell us exactly what happened. As per the USAC rulebook, the action is non-protestable. But we came here to win the race and if Scott was in the right -- which I firmly believe he was -- then we can prove it. If we'd taken the black flag we'd have been history anyway, so, I think we proved today what we had to prove. All the credit to Honda, who gave us the power to win this race, Firestone, who gave us the tires, and my very personal thanks to Scott who did a brilliant job all day."

Robert Clarke, General Manager, Honda Performance Development: "Scott's car ran flawlessly throughout the race. We did not have one problem with the engine during the entire race. We were thrilled with the performance of the engine, Scott and the entire team. Andre had an overheating problem at midrace that was caused by a plastic bag in the radiator duct. Later we had a misfire that at first was throughout to be electrical, he was sent back out but stalled on course. Then one of the crew found that part of the throttle linkage had broken. Unfortunately, we lost a lot of time in the pits, but Andre drove a great race."
